William served his country in the United States Army as a 2LT and received an Honorable Discharge. William graduated from Pembroke State University with a Bachelor of Science and from Stanly Community

College with a degree of Human Services Technology.

William was loved by his coworkers and members of the PSR. Robin Blackwell, Director of Randleman Day Program said, "William was a great coworker. He would do anything to help anyone. He was kind hearted, funny, always had a smile and lived to make a difference in the lives of the people he supported."

Marie Parsons, director of several group homes, stated the following: "William Pone was one of a kind. He was a wonderful friend and coworker. He worked hard at what he did and loved every minute of it. He loved the people that he supported and was always looking for new outings and things for them to do. I remember when he was trying to set up the exercise/game room for the Woodland House. He called me on numerous occasions to tell me what he had found and how cheap he got it, because it was going to the program and people were giving him such great deals. That was one room of the Woodland House that he was very proud of, and he enjoyed the people that he supported using it. William also covered many hours for me in the group homes. If I had a staff shortage, he was always there to cover and even came out in the middle of the night during a snow storm to relieve one of the other staff. Once again, William Pone was one of a kind and is missed dearly by me, the group homes and the people at the Woodland House."

Left to grieve his loss and to cherish fond memories are William's wife, Michelle and their three sons. Our condolences go out to Michelle and the family! William will always hold a special place in our hearts!
